

Heather Hill Master Condominium Association Hurricane Preparedness Recommendations

Inform someone of where you are, preferably a Board Member.

Make sure your key is current with the Association. It is Florida Law that you provide the Association with a key.

Per the condominium documents, if you leave for a more than two (2) weeks you must remove all personal items you may have outside. In the case of a hurricane, all residents must move all personal outside items including door mats. Tables turned upside down on the patio does not count. (It also tells people you are gone and this opens your place up to possible robbery and is un-slightly to the community.)

If you are a seasonal resident, empty and turn off your refrigerator. It is recommended that you also unplug it. If you are here during a hurricane and evacuate, empty and turn off your refrigerator. The FEMA team captain recommends that you shut the breakers off on all major appliances.

If you leave your AC running during the summer, make sure you have someone that can shut it off at the breakers in the event of a major power outage. The power surge can burn out your appliances as well as your AC. AC units should be powered back up once the power has been restored.

If you leave a vehicle on property, leave a key with a board member.

All pool and patio furniture will be moved to the interior of the club house.

The pool will be closed with the onset of a hurricane. The pool pump will be powered down and turned off at the breakers. The pool will remain closed until the pool service company has serviced it after the passing of the storm.

Club House AC and refrigerator will be turned off at the breakers during a hurricane.
